Г 	Tornadoes usually develop during thunderstorms, mainly in the spring and summer.
_ -	Thunderstorms usually develop between May and September in the Northern Hemisphere. In the Southern Hemisphere, they develop between November and March.
' -	Thunderstorms are the most frequent in temperate and tropical regions.
 -	The appearance of several tornadoes over a broad region is called a tornado outbreak.
 	The United States has the most reported tornadoes per year, especially in the Great Plains region.
	Thunderstorms are usually violent and short-lived. They almost always include thick clouds, heavy rain or hail, lightning, thunder, and strong winds.
	A tornado is a column of strongly rotating winds. It can produce winds as fast as 300 miles (483 kilometers) per hour.
